✝ A Very Special Christmas Gift

It is the day before Christmas nineteen forty-nine. A young father had just discovered that his five-year-old daughter had wasted an entire roll of rather expensive gold wrapping paper. His daughter had crudely wrapped the paper around a small cardboard box that she had placed behind the family's modest little Christmas tree. Money was very tight at the time and that made the matter seem even worse. The father called the little girl into the room and began to scold her for having wasted the paper on the box. The little girl entered the room and began slowly approaching her father who was standing there holding the small crudely wrapped box. Her father began his verbal reprimand as he watched his daughter run to him. As the father continued with his scolding the little girl quickly approached and placed her tiny hands on the box her father was holding. Then the little girl tenderly said, "This is for you, daddy!" The father's anger was quickly defused, and the matter was dropped as the box was placed back beneath the Christmas tree. However, on Christmas Day the father's anger flared again when he opened the box and found it was empty. He again spoke to his daughter in a harsh manner saying, "Don't you know, young lady, when you give someone a present there's supposed to be something inside the package?" The little girl had tears in her eyes as she looked upwards at her father. Then the little girl said, "Oh, daddy, it's not empty! I blew kisses into it until it was full." The father was crushed. He fell on his knees and put his arms around his little girl, and he begged his daughter's forgiveness for his outburst of anger and for his thoughtlessness. The father always kept that little box beside his bed afterwards. When times were hard or difficult, he would often remember the box full of kisses and could recognise a feeling of deep comfort and love. Often he would look at that small crudely wrapped golden box and again hear the same precious words that his daughter had spoken to him on that Christmas day. "This is for you, daddy!" Three Tips from Pope Francis on How to Share the Faith This Christmas

Pope Francis's document "The Joy of the Gospel" is loaded with great tips on how to share the faith with others. Since the Christmas season gives us plenty of opportunities to talk about our faith with others, I thought I'd share three of my favourite tips from the pope on how to do so.

1. Appeal to people's deepest desires.

This is the common denominator in our humanity: we are all looking for "something" – some kind of happiness, some kind of fulfilment. All sharing of who Christ is (and why people should care) must begin with an appeal to that longing for life, love, and happiness, witnessing to the eternal banquet that satisfies our deepest hunger. As Pope Francis says... "All Christian formation consists of entering more deeply into the message capable of responding to the desire for the infinite which abides in every human heart" (Joy of the Gospel 165). "Instead of seeming to impose new obligations, we should appear as people who wish to share their joy, who point to a horizon of beauty, and who invite others to a delicious banquet" (Joy of the Gospel 15).

2. Speak of your faith in everyday language.

It's an obvious point that, if we are to communicate, we need to speak in a language that people understand. But it's a point that is often ignored for some reason when it comes to sharing the faith. As Pope Francis says... Today's "vast and rapid cultural changes demand that we constantly seek ways of expressing unchanging truths in a language which brings out their abiding newness. 'The deposit of faith is one thing . . . the way it is expressed is another'" (Joy of the Gospel 41). The language we use "must be one that people understand, lest we risk speaking to a void. ... our greatest risk is that we become so accustomed to our own language that we think that everyone else naturally understands and uses it. If we wish to adapt to people's language and to reach them with God's word, we need to share in their lives and pay loving attention to them" (Joy of the Gospel 158).

3. Remain open to the fire of the Holy Spirit

If evangelization means bringing Christ to the world, Mary was the first evangelist. How did she do it? How did she bring Christ to the world? The Holy Spirit came upon her and she conceived (see Lk 1:34–35). The Holy Spirit—the fire of God—is the very source of evangelization. Hence, evangelization is simply impossible unless we remain open to this fire. As Pope Francis says... Evangelisers must be "fearlessly open to the working of the Holy Spirit. At Pentecost, the Spirit made the apostles go forth from themselves and turned them into heralds of God's wondrous deeds, capable of speaking to each person in his or her own language. The Holy Spirit also grants the courage to proclaim the newness of the Gospel with boldness in every time and place, even when it meets with opposition" (Joy of the Gospel 259). "How I long to find the right words to stir up enthusiasm for a new chapter of evangelization full of fervour, joy, generosity, courage, boundless love and attraction! Yet I realise that no words of encouragement will be enough unless the fire of the Holy Spirit burns in our hearts" (Joy of the Gospel 261).
