## Mustard Seeds

#### **A Silent Sermon**

A member of a certain Parish, who previously had been attending Mass regularly, stopped going. After a few weeks, the priest decided to visit him. It was a chilly evening. The priest found the man at home alone, sitting before a blazing fire. Guessing the reason for his priest's visit, the man welcomed him, led him to a comfortable chair near the fireplace and waited. The priest made himself at home but said nothing. In the grave silence, he contemplated the dance of the flames around the burning logs. After some minutes, the priest took the fire tongs, carefully picked up a brightly burning ember and placed it to one side of the hearth all alone. Then he sat back in his chair, still silent. The host watched all this in quiet contemplation. As the one lone ember's flame flickered and diminished, there was a momentary glow and then its fire was no more. Soon it was cold and dead. Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting. The priest glanced at his watch and realised it was time to leave, he slowly stood up, picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire. Immediately it began to glow, once more with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it. As the priest reached the door to leave, his host said with a tear running down his cheek, "Thank you so much for your visit and especially for the silent, fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday."

#### St. Peter Eymund Climbs a Ladder

The intimacy with God in the Eucharist leads us faithfully along the path to heaven, but it also leads along the path to a fruitful, meaningful life while we are here on earth. St. Peter Julian Eymund is a great example of this. He lived in France during the stormy years after the French Revolution. He grew up in a poor family, and his first attempt to enter the seminary ended in failure - he was sent home when he became too ill to carry on. That was only the first of many obstacles, but none of them could hold back his energy and zeal for serving God and neighbour. He struggled mightily to make it through seminary. Then he joined one religious order, only to leave it in order to start his own, fighting against all odds to make it grow and take root in the Church. Amidst constant troubles and even violent opposition, and plagued by chronic sickness and insuperable poverty, he nevertheless founded a parallel order of nuns, an association of lay people, and another association of diocesan clergy. He wore himself out and died at the age of 57. What was the source of his boundless energy, tireless charity, and unbending enthusiasm? The Eucharist. All his foundations, in fact, were dedicated to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, a practice he had begun while just a boy. One day when he was only five-years-old his sister found him in church, perched on a stepladder behind the main altar, with his ear pressed up against the Tabernacle. She asked him what he was doing. He simply said that he wanted to get closer to the Eucharist so he could hear "Him" better. Eternal life reaches its fullness in heaven, but it begins here on earth, where, our faith tells us, it is nourished by Christ truly present in the Eucharist.

#### Solemnity of the Assumption this Week

What does Solemnity of the Assumption celebrate? On August 15, the Church celebrates the fact that Mary, the Mother of God, was assumed into Heaven at the end of her earthly life. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 974) teaches, "The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body." In a homily for the Assumption, Pope St. John Paul II said, "Taken up into Heaven, Mary shows us the way to God, the way to Heaven, the way to life. She shows it to her children baptised in Christ and to all people of good will. She opens this way especially to the little ones and to the poor, those who are dear to divine mercy. The Queen of the world reveals to individuals and to nations the power of the love of God...." Masses on Tuesday, 15th August at 10am and 7pm.

#### **Re-Introduction of Chalice Communion**

Receiving the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist from the cup is not a requirement, but receiving the blood of Christ is a fuller sign of the mystery we celebrate. This question continues to be asked, reflecting an uneasiness for some laypeople about resuming a practice unknown in the Roman Catholic Church for more than 600 years. In the church's first thousand years, Communion under a single species occurred only as a pastoral exception for infants, the sick, and the dying. The gradual reserving of the cup to ordained clergy early in the second millennium was to safeguard against spills and counteract the erroneous view that the laity needed both species to receive the whole Christ. Today's restored opportunity to receive the sacramental Blood as well as Body of Christ lets us equally honour two invitations: "Eat my Body. Drink my Blood." Receiving from the cup is a heightened liturgical experience of sacrifice, covenant, unity, and sacred banquet. In the gospels, drinking from the cup is a sign of courageous discipleship. "Can you drink the cup that I will drink?" Jesus challenges. In the Garden of Gethsemane the same image expresses the ordeal awaiting Jesus. Not surprisingly, then, Communion from the cup implied for the early Christians an openness to martyrdom, a willingness to lay down one's life. Our short answer to anyone who asks, "Do I have to receive from the cup?" is certainly no; it is not imposed. As a concerned friend or parent, however, we might gently add, "But do you realise what you are missing?"

#### **Pastoral Guidance on "Direct Cremations"**

You may have seen advertised on TV or elsewhere "Direct Cremations" or "Pure Cremations" i.e. a Cremation of the deceased with no one present and no ceremony in the presence of the deceased. These are marketed by stressing two main claims: (a) they are cheaper than a "conventional" funeral; (b) very few people "like" funerals so why should we have them? Anyone considering this option should feel free to speak to Fr Duncan in advance if possible, so alternatives and options around "Direct Cremations" - including having a low or no-cost Memorial Service even on the same day, can be explored. While everyone needs to make their own decisions on this sensitive area and the Church will always support the bereaved, Funerals are nonetheless important occasions. We don't have Funerals because we "like" them but so that people can gather, be supported in their grief, and the deceased be prayed for and commended to God on their final journey.






