It is intended to help make your wedding planning process as stress-free as possible! Know that we in the Church are praying for you throughout this time of preparation. Marriage Timeline Planner

V By <u>12 months before the anticipated wedding date</u>

Meet with the Parish Priest, Father Duncan, to initiate the marriage preparation process and set the date of the wedding - 'phone 01294 464063 or email: fr.duncan@schoenstatt.org.uk

Please don't book a Reception venue without checking that the date and time is suitable for the Church first.

Before a wedding date can be set, the couple should meet with the priest to determine that nothing is preventing the couple from marriage in the Catholic Church.

Fill in the Pre-Nuptial Enquiry Form with the priest. Bring along the Baptismal Certificates of the Bride and Groom from your own Churches of Baptism. Certificates should not be more than six months old. In other words, it has to be a new Certificate, not the original one.

If you have just moved into the Parish, i.e. in the last couple of years, it is better to get a "Letter of Freedom" from your previous Parish Priest from your last address. Just ask him for a "Letter of Freedom", tell him your address and the years that you lived there. Then, bring this with you.

The priest will give you a booklet with suggested Readings from the Bible for the Wedding, suggested Bidding Prayers and a booklet outlining the Marriage Service.

Pray together for God's blessings as you prepare for marriage.

V By <u>9</u> months before the wedding date

If you are sending special invitations to family and friends, why don't you include a short prayer for your wedding day. Guests at your wedding are then invited to pray for you and your intentions. What a beautiful gift!

V By <u>6</u> months before the wedding date

Complete the Marriage Preparation Course . Be sure to obtain your Certificate of attendance and give this to the priest at the next meeting with him.

If you would like to book an organist or order special flowers for the ceremony, then confirm this with the priest.

You might wish to order a special wedding candle, which will be lit during the Ceremony. The Parish Office has the brochure and contact details. Please don't leave it too late!

This is a great time to pray a rosary together for your future marriage and family. If you don't have a Rosary, you can get one at the Parish Shop at the back of Church. Please have a look at "How to pray the Rosary" on our Parish Website.

V By <u>3</u> months before the wedding date

Meet with the priest again to plan the Wedding Ceremony. You need to think about and confirm:

- Nuptial Mass or Wedding Ceremony
- Which Readings from the Bible and Bidding Prayers
- Choice of music
- Flowers if needed
- Wedding Candle
- Names and addresses of witnesses
- · Names and addresses of Best Man and Chief Bridesmaid
- Names of Bridesmaids or Page Boys, etc.
- Names of Readers
- Arrange date and time for rehearsal

Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (if Catholic). At St Peter in Chains there is usually always the opportunity for Confession on Saturdays, between 4.45pm and 5.15pm.

W By <u>1</u> week before the wedding date - Rehearsal in Church

A rehearsal should take place in Church about one week before the wedding date.

We will confirm all the details of the Ceremony then.

We recommend that all the fees for the wedding should be arranged at the rehearsal: For example: the organist - £50.

There is no fee for a Wedding at St Peter in Chains. However, the Parish would be grateful for a donation if possible. The amount of the donation is up to your generosity and should be compared to the other expenses you have for the wedding.

If you pay tax, then using the special Parish Donation Envelopes brings an extra 22% to the Parish from your donation. All you have to do is write your name and address on the special envelope. Please ask the priest for one. Thank you for your support!
